

### **Absurdity Solution**

Look at what Black might have done on his last move. The only possible previous move by black is ...e7-e5 (preceded by White's Rf6-c6 discovered check.) Therefore, White may play PxP e.p., mate.

White also has R-Q1, mate. But, he cannot give mate by castling. White's pawns have made 14 captures, all of Black's missing pieces, all west to east. They must have included Black's QRP. Since White is not missing any pieces, the pawn could not have taken anything, but advanced straight ahead and promoted on QR8, later moving and being captured elsewhere. Therefore, the white rook must have moved at some point.

So there are two mates in one from the position.
